**Boston Clinic Will Treat  
Goiters by New Methods**

**BOSTON (INS)** — The man who  
pioneered the use of radioactive  
iodine in treatment of goiter open-  
ed the world's first Radioactive  
Isotope Research Institute in Bos-  
ton on June 15.

He is Dr. Saul Hertz, who be-  
gan his experiments with radio-  
active iodine for goiter treatment  
in 1937. There was no cyclotrons  
in those days, so the doctor made  
his own radioactive iodine.

The pioneer product was made  
by bombarding ethyl iodine with  
neutrons from beryllium and rad-  
ium. The construction of cyclo-  
trons at Massachusetts Institute of  
Technology and Harvard stepped  
up the process with tellurium get-  
ting the bombardment.

The Oak Ridge atomic pile made  
the old method obsolete.

However, Dr. Hertz found that  
even the atomic pile does not dis-  
tribute as quickly as the demand  
requires. This lag comes mostly in  
the need for caution and expense  
in handling.

The Research Institute will  
handle the tricky treatment. This  
specialization means more efficient  
distribution to patients in New  
England.

Dr. Hertz calls his thyroid treat-  
ment "oral administration of  
X-Ray, with selectivity." His meth-  
od, he claims, has been 100 per  
cent successful in 3,500 cases treat-  
ed to date at 28 hospital clinics.

The new foundation will eventu-  
ally be known as the Hertz Re-  
search Institute. Dr. Hertz will  
dedicate it to the memory of his  
parents, the late Aaron and Ber-  
tha Hertz of Cleveland, and to  
his brother, Jules, who was killed  
in Germany while serving as a  
private first class with the U. S.

Army during World War II.

It was money from the estate of  
Jules which formed the nucleus of  
funds necessary for construction of  
the Institute.
